## **Community Investment** United Way of Washington County-East

#### Our annual Community Investment funding process is underway!

Each year, UWWCE invites agencies working in our community to submit grant applications for specific programs that are categorized under one of our four focus areas: Youth, Health, Basic Needs, and Self-Sufficiency. Programs address immediate or emerging needs, with special focus on those that emphasize prevention and early problem solving. Volunteers manage the Community Investment process and include members of the United Way of Washington County East Board of Directors, healthcare professionals, Washington County professionals, business professionals and community members.

The first Community Investment meeting for this cycle took place on May 14th and included an implicit bias training with Dr. Shawn Moore of Eckberg Lammers and a review of county data from Dave Brummel, Director of Public Health & Environment at Washington County. Both speakers were engaging and prepared the volunteers to review grant applications and perform site visits. Volunteers split into smaller groups and are currently completing site visits to the nonprofit grant applicants. The larger group will reconvene on June 18th to make funding decisions totaling \$460,000.
