Over 126 individuals, representing 29 volunteer groups, gave their time and energy to help sort, organize, and pack supplies. We are so grateful to all of them, this was truly a team effort. Data showed that 6th grade is a pivotal time in a young person's life – a point where confidence, friendships, and self-image can set the tone for years to come. One of our board members suggested, "Why not host a retreat?" And from that idea, You R You was born.

This year, we were thrilled to host our second annual retreat, welcoming **81 girls for a full day of friendship, confidence, and self-discovery.** Thanks to our core session leaders from Tubman, The Emily Program, and FamilyMeans, along with the dedication of **35 volunteers** and **16 teen guides**, the day was filled with opportunities to connect, reflect, and shine. 
